

Solo and Ensemble Festival Reminders:

Forms/Fees:

- Registration forms and fees are due **Tuesday, March 9th**. Turn in **one form** per event. Members of a duet, trio, ensemble, etc. should turn in one form for their event along with the complete fee for that event. Members of one event should not turn in separate forms and fees for the same event. If you are doing a Solo and some sort of ensemble, you should have a separate form and separate payments for both events. Do not combine monies from two different events in the same envelope. Do not fold up the form and put it in the envelope. Staple the form to the envelope please. **Checks are payable to W.T. Woodson Band Patrons.**

Music/Grading:

- Music selected should be standard literature for your instrument and that which is appropriate for this event. Private teachers should help you select a solo. No pop, rock tunes or movie themes please.
- If you are unsure of the grade of your solo or ensemble we can look it up for you. Any piece not in the VBODA manual will be registered as “ungraded”.
- A student must have piano accompaniment for solos (or other works) that require a piano part. A student will not receive a rating if they perform without the required piano accompaniment. A list of piano accompanists may be obtained through the Woodson Band office.
- Two copies of the score are required. Judges should be given an original. The judge’s score must have the measures numbered.

Other factors:

- Students should dress appropriately for this event. Students found to be dressed inappropriately will be sent home. Wear dressy casual clothing. No jeans, sneakers, flip flops, hats, etc. Remember that you are representing Woodson H.S. at this event.
- Students will not receive the adjudicator’s sheet or their rating at the time of the performance. Ratings will be posted in a central location shortly after the student’s performance. Adjudicator’s sheets will be forwarded to the respective band or orchestra director a few days following the event.
